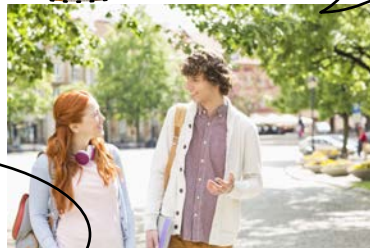


Invitations: accepting and refusing
