



Example answers for questions

Examples translator

1. I want a job as a translator. Some requirements for this job include being able to speak multiple languages fluently and being able to understand different cultures.
2. Some of the duties and responsibilities of a translator include translating documents and conversations, interpreting for people who do not speak the same language, and helping people communicate with each other.
3. I would prepare for a job interview by studying the company's culture and values, and by practicing my language skills.
4. The job of a translator might have a high turnover because it is a very demanding job and requires a lot of skill.
5. I might get fired from my job as a translator if I made too many mistakes, if I was not able to communicate effectively, or if I did not respect the company's culture and values.

Examples flight attendant

1. I want to be a flight attendant. Some requirements for this job include being at least 18 years old, having a high school diploma or equivalent, and being able to pass a background check and drug test.
2. Some of the duties and responsibilities of a flight attendant include providing customer service to passengers, maintaining cabin safety, and assisting with emergency procedures.
3. To prepare for a job interview, I would research the company, brush up on my customer service skills, and practice answering common interview questions.
4. The job of a flight attendant has a high turnover because it is a physically and emotionally demanding job with irregular hours.
5. I might get fired from my job as a flight attendant if I was not able to meet the physical demands of the job, if I had a bad attitude with passengers, or if I violated safety procedures.
