Note: this includes example answers.

1. Tell me about yourself.

- I'm from Pine Tree School, and I'm really into math and painting. I've got two brothers, and we love to go camping!
 - Follow-up Question That sounds lovely! Can you tell me more about your favorite subject or hobby?

2. What kind of job are you looking for?

- I'd like to find a job where I can help people, maybe like a helper in the library?
- I'm looking for something fun, like working in a toy store or maybe helping with art classes.
 - Follow-up Question Interesting! What makes you interested in that particular type of work?

3. Do you know the requirements for this job?

- Yes, I read the job description, and I think I can do it! You need someone who's responsible and good with people, right?
- Hmm, I think so. You need someone who can work on weekends and likes to be around animals?
 - Follow-up Question Are there any other requirements?

4. What are your strengths? Best skills?

- I'm very organized, and I love helping people. I think those are my best skills.
- I'm quite creative, and I'm also really patient with younger kids.
- Follow-up Question That's great! How do you think those skills will help you in this job?

5. What is your major weakness?

- Sometimes I'm a bit shy, especially when meeting new people.
- I can be a little forgetful, but I'm learning to write things down so I remember.
 - Follow-up Question It's good to recognize that. How are you working on improving that weakness?

6. What are your future plans?

- I want to be a teacher when I grow up, so I'm working hard in school!
- I hope to become a veterinarian. I love animals, you see!
 - Follow-up Question That sounds exciting! How are you preparing for that future goal?

7. What things are most important to you in a work situation?

- I think it's important to work hard and be kind to everyone.
- I want to learn new things and meet new friends!
- Follow-up Question Those are great values! How do you think you can contribute to a positive work environment?

8. If you had a choice, would you prefer to work alone or as part of a team? Why?

- I like working in a team because we can help each other and share ideas.
- I think I work better alone. I can focus more and get things done my way.
 - Follow-up Question Good to know! So, are you a leader or a follower?
